

To Kill a Mockingbird iTunes Project

For this project, you will create an iTunes playlist for a specific character or theme from the novel. You may work with a maximum of **two** other people. Your project should include the following:



1. Create a **visual** that clearly shows the playlist
2. Eight song titles Choose option A or B
 - a. Create your own original song titles
 - b. Choose seven real songs that apply and write one original song
3. Original lyrics for **one** of your songs (at least 10 lines)
4. Typed 3-4 sentence explanation of each title (this means that you should be referencing something specific from the novel in your explanation)

Grading Criteria

- ✓ Your visual should be neat and creative (spelling and punctuation count!)
- ✓ The playlist should cover *all* of Part I
- ✓ Your explanations should be thoughtful and clearly connect your song title to the novel.

Presentation

- ✓ Overview of the playlist and discussion of how they reflect your chosen character or theme
- ✓ A reading of your original lyrics

Extra Credit

You will receive extra credit if you actually create a melody for your original song and record it. Produce your song, and you'll have some extra points thrown your way!
